Bankrupting the Church The state of the economy vs Church finances

To have <u>purposed</u> in one's heart means that we take the amount chosen in front of anything else.

* Storing up as we have prospered

To <u>lay by in store</u> means to appoint it and store it away so that it is not used for anything it is not appointed for.

We give not grudgingly nor out of necessity

To <u>not give grudgingly nor out of necessity</u>, means that once what we purpose to give we have done it cheerfully and willingly.

* We need to clearly understand what God desires for us, why He desires it, and it means to give with a purpose, as He has prospered us, giving willingly and cheerfully.
