Great Questions Asked

Why is it that man asks questions? The answer, to learn. What did the apostle Paul find in Athens? Men sitting around all day for no other reason than “to tell or to hear some new thing.” (Acts 17 : 21)

Think about how many times the Bible speaks of Jesus answering Questions. Why did He do this? So that people would learn. Think back to yesteryears; how many questions did you have when you were little? Why is the sky blue, Grandma, how old are you, etc. We had such a desire to learn, to know things.

Today we focus on my Top Five List of Greatest Questions Asked. What is it that these people wanted to know? And what were the answers? We need a desire to learn, to gain knowledge. The way we can do this is by taking a page from the Bible, asking questions and seeking (listening) to the answers.
