Have you prepared to hear?

Preparation for any task is potentially as or more important than the task itself. A professional football team will spend more time preparing with meetings, film sessions, walk-throughs, and practice than they do actually playing the game itself.

In the same manner, if you were sent to a seminar for work would you not prepare yourself by reading up on that which you were sent to learn about?

Each and every Lord's day we come together to partake of the Lord's Supper, give to the collection, sing praises, offer prayer, and hear a portion of God's words.
