Based on or conforming to accepted standards vs. Different from that which is accepted
- * Love
An intense feeling of deep affection vs. Action
- * Why do we withdraw from our Brethren?
Convention tells us—It is commanded, a little leaven, and evil company corrupts.
In reality its LOVE
- * We love him.
If they really loved him, they would show it.
- * So, why do we withdraw?
It is commanded, A little leaven does leaven the whole, and Evil company does corrupt.
But most importantly because we Love them.
- * What does it mean to withdraw?
“...not to keep company...not even to eat...put away...do not receive...greet...”
- * Keep in mind this is not anger, not resentfulness, but Love.
Restoration and Salvation is the goal.
