Twelve Prophets (Aramaic: Trei Asar, "The Twelve"), occasionally Book of the Twelve, is the eighth and last book of the Nevi'im, the second main division of the Jewish Tanakh. The collection is broken up to form twelve individual books in the Christian Old Testament, one for each of the prophets.

12 Prophets - Nahum

‘nachum’ (h) – comfort

‘nacham’ (h) – properly to sigh; by implication to be sorry, that is, to pity, console

Nahum brings comfort. The book of comfort.

Nahum 1 – The Lord is good.

He reserves wrath, He is slow to anger, He knows those who trust in Him

Nahum 2 – The Lord will restore

No one will help Nineveh, she will be desolate, I am against you

Nahum 3 – Consider No Amon

This undefeatable city, was defeated...who can stop Me?

12 Prophets - Habakkuk

‘chabaqquq’ (h) – embrace

Habakkuk is a book written from 3 perspectives:

Habakkuk asking God where His embrace has gone

God revealing His plan to Habakkuk

Habakkuk finding comfort in God’s revealed salvation

Habakkuk 1 – Two questions for God

How long shall I cry, And you not hear? Why do You hold Your tongue?

Habakkuk 1/2 – God’s Answers

I am sending someone to deal with this. It will come, wait for it, it will come...the proud will fall.

Habakkuk 3 – Habakkuk Embraces God

12 Prophets - Zephaniah

‘tsephanyah’ (h) – Jah has secreted

Jehovah has treasured, Jehovah hides

Zephaniah calls for the repentance of Judah so that they will be “hidden” in the day of the Lord’s wrath.

Zephaniah 1 – A sacrifice has been prepared

The sacrifice of His people

Zephaniah 2 – Repent

Seek the Lord – that you may be hidden in that day

Zephaniah 3 – 3 Scenes

Jerusalem has been wicked

Those who are faithful will remain

There is Joy in Faithfulness

12 Prophets - Haggai

‘khaggahee’ (h) – festive

‘chag’ (h) – a festival

Haggai is a book which relates priorities the way God sees them.

Haggai 1 – The people say – but God says

It is not time to build the temple...Is it time for you to build your houses while My house lies in ruins?

Haggai 2 – Is the work acceptable to you?

Which of you saw the temple before? How does it compare to now?
Man / Priest cannot make things holy or clean, only unclean. I can sanctify, only I can make something holy.

12 Prophets - Zechariah

‘zekaryah’ (h) – Jah has remembered

Zechariah name is the pivotal point throughout the book.
God will remember Israel and the promise of the Messiah.

Zechariah – the book of Messianic visions

Zechariah 2 – A new Jerusalem

Zechariah 3 – The High Priest & the BRANCH

Zechariah 6 – The coming Crowned King

Zechariah 11 – The true Shepherd is coming

Zechariah 12 – Deliverance through the house of David

Zechariah 13 – Sin is healed; the Shepherd dies

Zechariah 14 – Oh worship the King

12 Prophets - Malachi

‘malakiy’ (h) – ministrative

‘malak’ (h) – a messenger, specifically of God

Malachi is God’s messenger of God’s disappointment in a lack of love toward Him, His service, and His love towards His people.

Malachi 1 – The Lord’s disappointment in Israel’s offerings

Where is My honor, My reverence?

Malachi 2 – The Lord’s disappointment in His priests

You are nothing like Levi

Malachi 3 – The Lord’s disappointment in their offerings

You have robbed Me – give what is mine, and I will bless you

Malachi 4 – The Lord will deliver Israel
