"Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die!"

## What has God called for today?

Matthew 5:4

"Blessed are they that mourn..."

James 4:9

"Lament and mourn...Let your laughter be turned to mourning..."

'pentheo' – to mourn, grieve

And yet what is the attitude of man today?

#### Did Jesus raise from the dead?

Yes – But what does this mean for us?

James 4:10

I Corinthians 15: 34, 57 - 58

II Kings 20:1 (Isaiah 38:1)

"Set your house in order, for you shall die, and not live."

'tsavah' (h) – to constitute, enjoin; to command, charge, give orders, lay charge, give charge to, order

If God were to tell you this today, what 'house' would you be worried about?

Will, Life Insurance, Bills (mortgage, car payments, etc.), Money

I want you to think of your spiritual house.

What would it take for you to get it in "order"?

Baptism, Repentance, Forgiveness

There will be no time when He does come.

"Behold, I am coming quickly!..."

If tomorrow we die, what is our mindset for today?

Hebrews 11:13

"...strangers and pilgrims on the earth."

I Peter 1:1;2:11

"...pilgrims..."

'parepidemos' – an alien alongside, that is, a resident foreigner; in the NT metaphorically in reference to heaven as the native country, one who sojourns on earth

"...sojourners..."

'paroikos' – having a home near, that is, (as a noun) a bydweller (alien resident); in the NT, a stranger, a foreigner, one who lives in a place without the right of citizenship

If tomorrow we die, what is today?

II Corinthians 6:2

Today is the "...accepted time...the day of salvation."

Acts 22:16

"...why are your waiting?..." (tarriest – KJV)

'mello' - to intend, that is, be about to be, do, or suffer something; to be on the point of doing or suffering something

#### "When will I die?"

I do not know, but I would make the same suggestion God did to Hezekiah – "Set your house in order."
