Nehemiah 8 : 1 – 8

The people came to hear

They gathered together

They were assembled, in close proximity "all who could hear"

Men and women – those with understanding

They are attentive

Ezra planned to speak

He stands on a platform – which they made for this very purpose He stood above the people – so all could see and hear He read distinctively – clearly so that all could comprehend He helped in understanding – so that all could understand

6 – The assembly said, "Amen!" – but why?

'Amen' – What does it mean?

'amen' (h) - sure; adverbially truly; so be it

'amen' (g) – properly firm at the beginning of a discourse – surely, of a truth at the end of a discourse – so it is, so be it, may it be fulfilled

used to express solemn ratification (as of an expression of faith) or hearty approval (as of an assertion)

'Amen' – When and Why is it used?

'amen' (g) – It was a custom, which passed over from the synagogues to the Christian assemblies, that when he who had read, discoursed, or had offered up a solemn prayer to God the others responded with Amen, and thus mad ether substance of what was uttered their own. *Thayer*

In English, it is used at the beginning, but more generally at the end of declarations and prayers, in the sense of, be it firm, be it established.

Why did the assembly say, "Amen?"

They agreed to do what was done, and what was said, "so be it!"

"The Fear of the Lord" (Proverbs 31)

The Fear of the Lord is ACTION
